This project aided the development of a digital cancer prehabilitation information platform and ensured its accessibility to patients, caregivers, and healthcare professionals in the SWAG region.

 Absence of standardised and coordinated delivery of prehabilitation services across the region → disparities in service quality

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
- Discrepancies in patient health literacy across the region and capacity to make informed healthcare decisions
- Varied cancer waiting times as patients become ineligible for treatment due to declining fitness



The development of the digital prehabilitation platform was guided by a collaborative effort between MSD and a diverse team of healthcare professionals across various trusts in the Cancer Alliance.

The platform is accessible to all healthcare professionals across the Cancer Alliance and aims to assist patients in optimising their physical health prior to commencing cancer treatment.

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
